### POSITIONS TO BE FILLED AND BASIC REQUIREMENTS:

1. DCM – 4 years of sobriety required – will represent District 90 and its groups at area assemblies; chairs district meetings and presents monthly report. Guides committee chairs with their duties and keeps all district members informed of area information.
2. ALTERNATE DCM – 4 years of sobriety required – represents DCM at area or district events if the DCM is unavailable. May assist with Area Assembly duties.
3. SECRETARY – Records district meeting discussions and presents reports for approval. Sends minutes to webmaster, Intergroup newsletter chair, and Intergroup office monthly.
4. TREASURER – Receives and records all donations to our district, pays all bills, records and present reports of all district financial activity.
5. CORRECTIONS CHAIR - oversees and coordinates AA activities at district penal facilities, oversees and trains volunteers who will chair meetings at each site and reports at each district meeting.
6. TREATMENT CHAIR – oversees AA activities and provides literature at treatment facilities and provides updates at district meetings.
7. Grapevine Chair – oversees availability of this service to groups or community service facilities; keeps district updated on Grapevine activities.
8. CPC Chair (Cooperation with the Professional Community) – our district representative who follows approved guidelines in introducing our services to local related providers.
9. PI Chair (Public Information) – our district representative who assists with information provided about AA to the public.
10. LITERATURE CHAIR – keeps district updated regarding new literature provided by AAWS for use or literature that has been discontinued. Can assist district efforts to provide other chairs with needed literature for individuals or events.
11. ACCESSIBILITIES CHAIR – assists with district or group efforts to provide for members with special needs.
12. INTERGROUP LIAISON – our district representative for the local intergroup attending their monthly meetings; reports our activities to Intergroup and their activities to us.
